Sacraments

Baptism: Baptisms are celebrated in our Parish on the first and third Sundays of the month at 12:30pm. Parents should contact the parish office at least two months before the desired date of baptism. An interview with a member of the pastoral staff and a Baptismal preparation class is required.

Confessions: The Sacrament of Confession is celebrated every Tuesday and Thursday before Mass, and every Saturday from 9:30am to 10:30am and 3:30pm to 4:30pm. You are also welcome to book an appointment with one of the priests by contacting the parish office.

Marriage: Weddings are celebrated in our Parish on any day except Sundays, Christmas, New Year's Day or during the Easter Triduum. Couples wishing to be married here should contact the parish office about one year before the desired date. Wedding dates will not be set until after the first interview with a Priest. Participation in a marriage preparation program is required.

Sacrament of the Sick: Parishioners are invited to receive the Sacrament of the Sick during a serious or chronic illness or before surgery. To arrange a time to receive the Sacrament, please contact the parish office.

FAITH FORMATION: THE DOCUMENTS OF VATICAN II

The Other Sacraments and the Sacramentals (cont'd)

- 75. The number of the anointings is to be adapted to the occasion, and the prayers which belong to the rite of anointing are to be revised so as to correspond with the varying conditions of the sick who receive the sacrament.
- 76. Both the ceremonies and texts of the ordination rites are to be revised. The address given by the bishop at the beginning of each ordination or consecration may be in the mother tongue.

When a bishop is consecrated, the laying of hands may be done by all the bishops present.

77. The marriage rite now found in the Roman Ritual is to be revised and enriched in such a way that the grace of the sacrament is more clearly signified and the duties of the spouses are taught.

"If any regions are wont to use other praiseworthy customs and ceremonies when celebrating the sacrament of matrimony, the sacred Synod earnestly desires that these by all means be retained" [41].

Moreover the competent territorial ecclesiastical authority mentioned in Art. 22, 52, of this Constitution is free to draw up its own rite suited to the usages of place and people, according to the provision of Art. 63. But the rite must always conform to the law that the priest assisting at the marriage must ask for and obtain the consent of the contracting parties.

78. Matrimony is normally to be celebrated within the Mass, after the reading of the gospel and the homily, and before "the prayer of the faithful." The prayer for the bride, duly amended to remind both spouses of their equal obligation to remain faithful to each other, may be said in the mother tongue.

But if the sacrament of matrimony is celebrated apart from Mass, the epistle and gospel from the nuptial Mass are to be read at the beginning of the rite, and the blessing should always be given to the spouses.

79. The sacramentals are to undergo a revision which takes into account the primary principle of enabling the faithful to participate intelligently, actively, and easily; the circumstances of our own days must also be considered. When rituals are revised, as laid down in Art. 63, new sacramentals may also be added as the need for these becomes apparent.

FROM THE LIONS' DEN Fatherhood Matters

Dear Family in Christ,

On behalf of Father Michael, I'd like to express our love and appreciation for all of you fathers in our parish family. We pray that you are able to spend time with your loved ones, and that you know how appreciated and essential you are to all of us at Our Lady of the Scapular. Additionally, Father Michael and I have the great honour of being your spiritual fathers. While this is a great privilege, it is also a challenge- mostly due to our own shortcomings. At any rate, we are grateful to God for entrusting to our care such beautiful souls, and pray for the grace to be good, holy fathers.

While we celebrate fatherhood, we see forces at work in our world who seem intent on erasing the difference between men and women, and the uniqueness of fatherhood and motherhood. We know the Evil One is intent on destroying the family. It seems like he does this by attacking fathers, and young men who would become fathers. Perhaps now more than ever, God is calling His Church to confront this attack.

Fatherhood matters because God has revealed Himself to be our Father, and every earthly father is only called one to the degree to which he conforms his heart to God's. It has been said that our mothers love us for the person we are, and our fathers love us for the person we could be. Of course, there are overlaps and caveats to this, but it remains true: the beauty of a father's love is that he recognizes the potential in his child, and through love and discipline calls forth that potential until it is fully realized. We know that, like a mother, God loves us for who we are. At the same time, like a Father, He knows that we were made for greatness, and His love calls us to that greatness-which is nothing other than sainthood.

I'd like to speak a word of comfort to the many who have been wounded by their experience of fatherhood-whether these be our own shortcomings as fathers, or the shortcomings of our own fathers, or even a priest. God is The Perfect Father, and in His love, all of our own shortcomings and wounds are an invitation to turn to Him, for Him to make up for what is lacking, and to let Him be Our Father.

On this 11th Sunday in Ordinary time, as we celebrate earthly fatherhood, let us pray for all fathers; that we would know the love of God, our Heavenly Father, and despite our shortcomings, be images of His love to those entrusted to our fatherly care.
