## **Sacraments**

**Baptism:** Baptisms are celebrated in our Parish on the first and third Sundays of the month at 12:30pm. Parents should contact the parish office at least two months before the desired date of baptism. An interview with a member of the pastoral staff and a Baptismal preparation class is required.

**Confessions:** The Sacrament of Confession is celebrated every Tuesday and Thursday before Mass, and every Saturday from 9:30am to 10:30am and 3:30pm to 4:30pm. You are also welcome to book an appointment with one of the priests by contacting the parish office.

**Marriage:** Weddings are celebrated in our Parish on any day except Sundays, Christmas, New Year's Day or during the Easter Triduum. Couples wishing to be married here should contact the parish office about one year before the desired date. Wedding dates will not be set until after the first interview with a Priest. Participation in a marriage preparation program is required.

**Sacrament of the Sick:** Parishioners are invited to receive the Sacrament of the Sick during a serious or chronic illness or before surgery. To arrange a time to receive the Sacrament, please contact the parish office.

**Hospital Ministry:** A Chaplaincy service is available to Catholics at the Niagara General Hospital.

# 6<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Easter ~ May 14, 2023 ~ Mother's Day

### **VATICAN II**

- 51. The treasures of the bible are to be opened up more lavishly, so that richer fare may be provided for the faithful at the table of God's word. In this way a more representative portion of the holy scriptures will be read to the people during a prescribed number of years.
- 52. By means of the homily the mysteries of the faith and the guiding principles of the Christian life are expounded from the sacred text, during the course of the liturgical year; the homily, therefore, is to be highly esteemed as part of the liturgy itself; in fact, at those Masses which are celebrated with the assistance of the people on Sundays and feasts of obligation, it should not be omitted except for a serious reason.
- 53. Especially on Sundays and feasts of obligation there is to be restored, after the Gospel and the homily, "the common prayer" or "the prayer of the faithful." By this prayer, in which the people are to take part, intercession will be made for holy Church, for the civil authorities, for those oppressed by various needs, for all mankind, and for the salvation of the entire world.
- 54. In Masses which are celebrated with the people, a suitable place may be allotted to their mother tongue. This is to apply in the first place to the readings and "the common prayer," but also, as local conditions may warrant, to those parts which pertain to the people, according to the norm laid down in Art. 36 of this Constitution.

Nevertheless, steps should be taken so that the faithful may also be able to say or to sing together in Latin those parts of the Ordinary of the Mass which pertain to them.

And wherever a more extended use of the mother tongue within the Mass appears desirable, the regulation laid down in Art. 40 of this Constitution is to be observed.

55. That more perfect form of participation in the Mass whereby the faithful, after the priest's communion, receive the Lord's body from the same sacrifice, is strongly commended.

The dogmatic principles which were laid down by the Council of Trent remaining intact [40], communion under both kinds may be granted when the bishops think fit, not only to clerics and religious, but also to the laity, in cases to be determined by the Apostolic See, as, for instance, to the newly ordained in the Mass of their sacred ordination, to the newly professed in the Mass of their religious profession, and to the newly baptized in the Mass which follows their baptism.

## "I Will Not Leave You Orphaned"

Dear Family in Christ,

On this 6th Sunday of Easter, the Church gives us the next installment of the Farewell Discourse from John's Gospel. Last Sunday, Jesus addressed the disciples' troubled hearts. This Sunday, Jesus makes them another comforting promise: *I will not leave you orphaned*. How comforting must this have been to those disciples who feared being abandoned- and how comforting it ought to be for us.

There are going to be times in our lives when we wonder if God has abandoned us. When things just aren't going our way, if our lives don't turn out the way we had hoped, or we experience significant suffering, our faith in this promise of Jesus is tested. It can be easy to panic, and to forget His promise.

The Gospel this Sunday reminds us of that promise. No matter what we go through, Jesus will not abandon us; He will not leave us orphaned. One of the greatest signs of His steadfast love is the gift of motherhood. This Mothers' Day, let us thank God for His gift of our own mothers, and for the women in our lives who have shown us motherly love. Let us pray for all mothers, that they would reflect the tender, nurturing love of God in the way only a mother can.

Whether this has been our experience of motherhood or not, we can all turn to our Blessed Mother, Mary, whom we honour especially during this month of May.

## **Special Collection May 21:**

On Sunday, May 21 we will hold our next special collection. This collection will support the Pope's Pastoral Works. Canadian Catholics are asked to give generously to this papal collection, which is passed on to the Holy Father for his use among those stricken by natural disasters. Canada has been consistent in giving such funds to the Holy See, enabling the Pope to be even more generous in times of disaster.

## **FINANCIAL SITUATION**

As I have previously mentioned, the financial situation of the parish is somewhat tenuous. Our income in the first four months of 2023 has increased but because of inflation so has our expenses. The departure of Manon Bilodeau, our former Pastoral Assistant, and the decision not to hire a replacement, will reduce our expenses in the future. We are also not renewing the Parish subscriptions to the Word on Fire and Formed services which save us about \$6,000. However, we have just learned our annual insurance premiums will increase by 30 per cent (about \$2,700) as of June 30. In addition, we need to replace the lights in the Parish Hall soon (estimated cost of \$8,000). We are planning to install LED lights which will reduce our hydro bill. Once again, I am asking members of the Parish to increase their weekly contributions. We are also planning a fundraising event (a Trivia Night) for early September to help raise funds for the Parish Hall lights. More details will follow. I would like to thank the Parish Finance Council for their support and guidance in dealing with this situation. I will be available after Mass and other times to answer any questions or hear any comments about Parish finances. Please share your ideas and help us give our Parish the resources it needs to become a more vibrant community.
